Context Statement: Luke 10:25-37 records one of Jesus’ best-known parables, told in response to a lawyer’s question about inheriting eternal life and defining one’s neighbor. Like many of Jesus’ parables, it uses ordinary people and situations to reveal deep spiritual truth—showing that genuine love for God is proven through mercy toward others. In Luke’s Gospel, it highlights that true discipleship moves beyond words to action, as seen even in the often-overlooked role of the innkeeper.

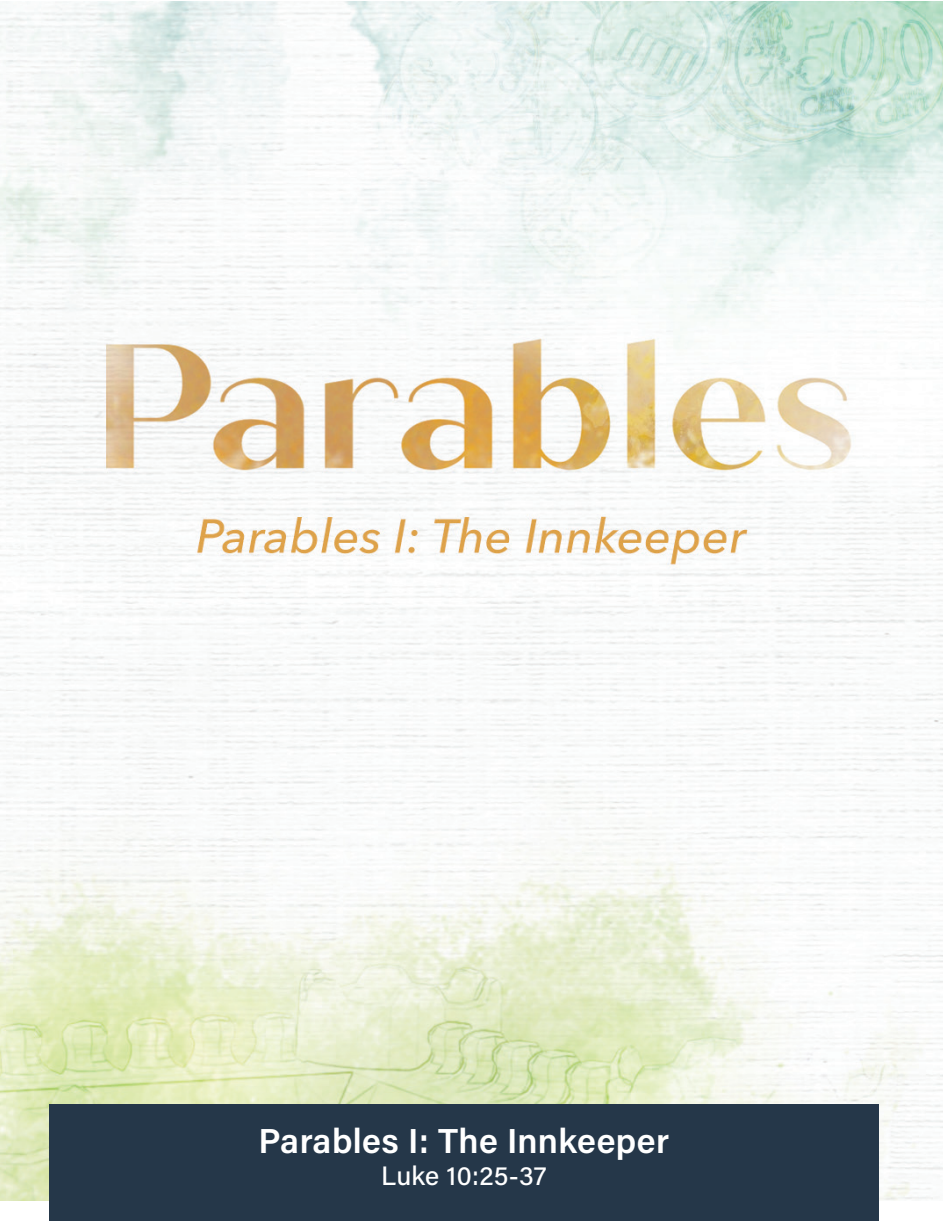
